Historical Information:	GREENWICH CEMETERY CEMETERY INDEX NUMBER, LONDON 29. GREENWICH Cemetery, on Shooters Hill, is within the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich and belongs to the Borough Council. It covers an area of 15 acres. The Cemetery contains 570 War Graves, which may be classified as follows:- Soldiers of United Kingdom units-500 Royal Navy-16 Overseas Military Forces of Canada-11 Australian Imperial Force-11 German Army-15 Royal Air Force-6 Royal Marine Light Infantry-2 Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service-2 New Zealand Expeditionary Force-2 Merchant Navy-2 British West Indies Regiment-2 South African Expeditionary Force-1 Of this number, 263 are buried in the "Heroes' Corner", a large War Plot on almost the highest point in the cemetery. The Cross is erected on the West side of this plot, and flanked by two curved screen walls carrying bronze panels; eleven panels bear the names of those who are buried in the plot, and ten the names of those whose graves are not marked by headstones. The majority of the dead were buried from the Herbert Hospital, one of the permanent Military Hospitals, or from the Brook War Hospital, established in the Metropolitan Asylums Board's Fever Hospital. The graves of 15 Belgian soldiers have been removed to Belgium. The Register records particulars of 555 War Graves.
