Cemetery: RAMICOURT BRITISH CEMETERY, Aisne, France
**Grave Reference/
Panel Number:** A. 18.
Location: Ramicourt is a village and commune in the Department of the Aisne, a few kilometres south-east of Gouy. The British Cemetery is on the south side of the village on the road to Levergies.

Historical Information: Ramicourt was immediately East of the German fortification known as the Beurevoir-Fonsomme Line. It contained a German Cemetery of 32 graves, now removed. It was captured by the 115th, 116th and 118th Sherwood Foresters on the 3rd October, 1918, and the cemetery was made immediately after, close to the German Cemetery, by the 18th Field Ambulance and the 18th Corps Burial Officer. There are now over 100, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site. The cemetery covers an area of 534 square metres and is enclosed by a brick wall on three sides.
